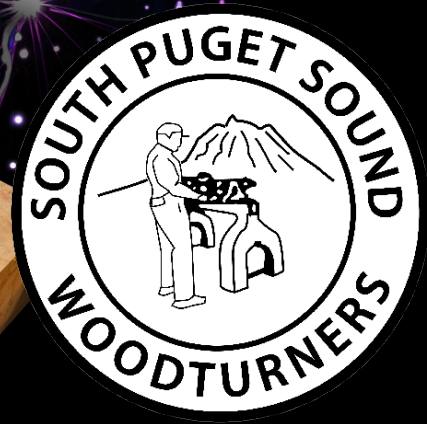
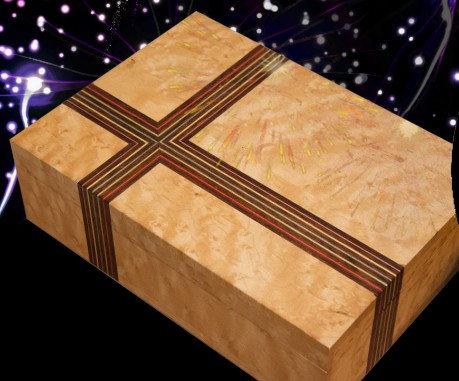
## January President's Message

**January's Remote Demo:** On January 21st, we are honored to again host Lyle Jamieson, who was our very first remote demonstrator last April. We were very happy to have chosen Lyle as our first remote demonstrator because, in addition to being a great teacher, he also helped us to work through the process of getting set up to utilize the Zoom Meetings platform.

During this presentation, Lyle will show us how to make a bowl "bigger than the piece of wood you start with." This is often called a "winged bowl". It is an interesting project, and one that builds skills for any woodturner.

If you are paid up as an active member, look for the meeting invitation in your inbox on January 16th, and a meeting reminder on Wednesday January 20th. Then please join us all between 6:30 and 7:00 on Thursday the 21st for Lyle's remote demonstration.

**February's Remote Demo:** For our February offering, we will again partner with the Woodturners of Olympia to present a nationally recognized woodturner. Harvey Meyer is famous for his intricate "basket illusion" enhancements on platters, bowls, and hollow forms. These turnings look like American Indian basketry when completed.

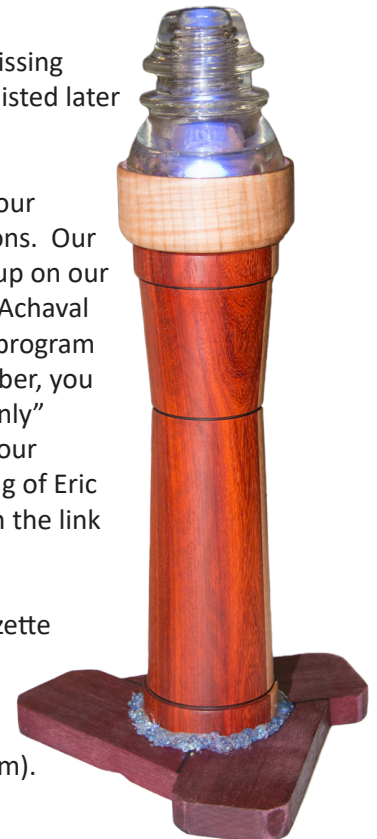

Just use the Zoom link to join us any time after 2:30 PM. Please mark your calendar now so you do not forget about this event!

Please join us. If you are not currently using Zoom to attend these events, you are missing something really good. If you need help to get started, you can just follow the steps listed later in this newsletter, or just call me or Ramon Lyn.

**Recordings of some of our previous remote demos available to members:** A few of our remote demonstrators have given us permission to record these virtual demonstrations. Our video librarian, John Jacobs, has worked hard to edit these recordings and put them up on our website under the "members only" tab. So far, we have the recordings for Emiliano Achaval turning his "Hawaiian Calabash", Ed Pretty's "Beyond ABC", and Scott Grove with his program on using resins for inlays and accents. **Active Member Registration:** Have you noticed that you don’t get all the communications that some other SPSW members get or that you are unable to view the meeting/remote demo videos? In order to get all benefits for active members, you need to be registered on our website and signed up for our member communication email list.



Only about half of our paid-up members are completely registered and signed up. If you aren’t registered, it is an easy problem to correct. Open our webpage at [www.spswoodturners.org](http://www.spswoodturners.org) and click on the “For Members” tab. The drop-down menu’s first choice is “How to Register”. Click on it, and there will be a short video that explains exactly how to get registered. After your registration is approved, the second step is required to complete the process. Go to our webpage and click on the “**Member Communication Sign-up**” under the For Members menu and follow the instructions.

**Free AAW Trial Membership Available to SPSW Members:** SPSW is a chapter of the American Association of Woodturners (AAW). Many of our members are just members of the chapter but not the American Association of Woodturners (AAW). The AAW offers an introductory free 3-month trial membership to chapter members. The free membership allows access to all online publications like The American Woodturner, Woodturning FUNdamentals magazine, and AAW e-newsletters . I recommend that you check it out! If you are interested, just click on the link below and it will connect you to the AAW’s website and a simple sign-up process.

**A few words about Harry Lincoln:** For those that did not see the e-mail that went out just before Christmas, I am very sorry to have to convey the sad news that a dear friend and member of the SPSW, Harry Lincoln, passed away in late October. Harry was one of those members that worked behind the scenes, but did so much for the SPSW and its members. For many years, Harry was the moving force behind having enough wood to have a wood auction. He arranged to get beautifully figured and colored tree trunks (usually big leaf maple) delivered to his house, led the crew cutting it up, sealed it, and then delivered it to where we had the auction. Harry also hosted many new woodturners in his shop where taught them to turn, gave them unbelievable exotic woods, and loaned out tools and equipment. Harry taught me a great deal about using a chain saw to process wood for turning seasoning, and how to glue up for laminated projects. Harry was a wonderful person, and I will miss him greatly!

**Zoom Meeting** If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. (If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)

1. The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members. So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2018, you will need to go to the members tab on the [SPSW website](http://spswoodturners.org) (<http://spswoodturners.org>) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
  - a. Those of you who get the newsletter by snail-mail will need to get us an e-mail address where we can send your meeting invitation. Please send it to ([membership@spswoodturners.org](mailto:membership@spswoodturners.org))
2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to [zoom.com](https://zoom.us) and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
3. **Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:**
  - a. **Saturday January 16th** – The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
    - i. This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
    - ii. Please save this where you can find it.
      1. If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
  - b. **Wednesday January 20th** – A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
  - c. **Thursday January 21st** - Log into the meeting between 6:30 and 7:00
    - i. Trent's demo will start shortly after the vote, at about 7:05 PM PDT.
    - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
    - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
    - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.

**For Zoom Security, Please Rename If Needed:** We have a number of people that participate in the Zoom demos. When you join the session, you will be able to see yourself and the other participants in thumbnail photos with the name of each person under their picture. If your name appears as "John's iPad", or "iPhone 189567", then we don't really know who you are, which is a security issue. If that happens when you join the meeting, please just click on your name, and then click "rename" and change it to your full name. It will help Ramon and me as we co-host the meeting. Thanks!
