
CHIPS AND SHAVINGS

President's Message

Important updates - please read carefully!

SPSW's Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update: First of all, I hope each of you are safe and well! The governor's "shelter in place" directive and the resultant closure of the Fife Community Center required cancellation of our regular March meeting, Sawdust Session, and the Board of Directors meeting too. The center is still closed, and will be until at least early May. Our club, and others like it, serve a membership predominantly composed of people very vulnerable to serious complications from this virus. Directives are changing far too rapidly for me to make any firm announcements about future

in-person meetings. But, I can tell you that we will be following all directives from the governor and Washington State Health Department.

So, if we can't have our normal meetings for a while, what are we going to do? Last week, I listened in on the AAW's webinar discussion addressing the advantages of doing "remote demonstrations" at chapter meetings. For the past 2 years, several AAW Chapters have been using internet technology that allows a person in their own shop to beam 2-way audio/visual feed to a regular chapter meeting. All the chapters that have used this method report great success! Members like it, world class demonstrators are available, and the club avoids the high cost of travel expenses. Importantly, this technology also allows people to view the demonstration from their home! This additional benefit makes this seem like a viable solution in this time of mandatory social distancing.

The April 16th Meeting: We held a board meeting using the Zoom program, just to test the ease of using this program. It worked very well! The board voted to try presenting a remote demonstration at our next meeting. So today, I called Lyle Jamison, who is well known for his hollowing system, and invited him to present on hollowing at the upcoming April 16th SPSW Meeting. Lyle has accepted and will be our speaker at this month's meeting. Lyle will be demon-

strating from his own shop in Michigan, and each of us can

see it from our own homes!

We will be sending directions by e-mail to all current members, for whom we have email addresses, on how to log into the meeting from your house. This e-mail will answer a lot of the questions I know you will have about how to download the app and participate in the meeting. All you need is a computer, tablet, or smartphone. You can fully participate with any of them. It helps if the device you use to view the demo has both video and audio capability. This is exciting!

2020 Bi-Monthly President's Challenges

Month	Challenge	Description	
March	Lidded Box	Lathe turned lidded boxes	
April	Shop Built Jigs	Items built to help make lathe turning more efficient or safer. Examples include, but are not limited to circle cutters, items used to make segments, and stabilizing blocks for cutting off spindles and tenons.	
June	Use of Color and Texture	Turned projects enhanced with paint, resin of stone inlay, pyrography, paint, dyes, etc.	
August	Children's Toys	Lathe turned items to play with, such as, but not limited to tops, toy rockets, croquet mallets, automatons, cryptic boxes, or other items that are lathe turned.	
November	Holiday Decor or Gift	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holidays, or a holiday gift that was turned on the lathe.	
January 2021	"The Podiatrist's Special"	Any lathe turning enhanced by unusual foot treatment. Judging will be based on how the foot design contributes to the aesthetics of the overall project.
