



November's Remote Demonstration: Trent Bosch is this month's demonstrator. Trent is highly regarded as an experienced teacher and as an inventor and tool manufacturer. One of his tools is his "Video Visualizer" hollowing system. Trent will be demonstrating what he calls his "Vessels of Illusion." These are a series of hollow-forms that are carved after turning so they look like an opening



Trent will open the Zoom meeting at 6:30PM on November 19th so people can get logged in and visit with the other members before Trent's demonstration starts shortly after 7:00PM.

Our remote demos have been gratefully received by all of those that have seen them. Our wood cutting activities have resulted in some great wood for many members. We currently have about 140 active members in the SPSW as of the end of 2020. We are now taking new dues payments for the 2021 year. Windfall: Due to current restrictions and falling membership, a sister organization in the area, the Evergreen Wood Workers Guild (EWWG) has chosen to disband. Like we are, they are a 501.c.3., and rules require that the assets of such an organization be transferred to another 501.c.3 organization. EWWG's board chose to donate slightly under eight thousand dollars to the SPSW! On the one hand, I am happy to report this cash infusion into the SPSW coffers. But, on the other hand, I will miss all the great people and all the wonderful programs that the EWWG was offering to the area's wood working community!

The SPSW board is discussing several options for how to best use these funds. We decided to offer 1 year of free membership in the SPSW to the remaining members of the EWWG. We are also considering putting together a system of equipment that would allow us to have individual members do remote demonstrations just like the ones we have been doing since April. We could also utilize this system to do shop tours and other activities that might be interesting to the membership. I am working with Ramon Lyn and we are evaluating the systems some of the professional demonstrators use. We will have to see where it goes.

December Meeting/Party Postponed: I'm sorry to announce that considering the continuing unavailability of the Fife Community Center and current group meeting restrictions, we will be unable to safely host our annual holiday potluck dinner. Therefore, your Board of Directors decided to postpone the holiday party and wood give-away until we are able to safely meet in person.

Since so many people already have a full calendar in December, we have also decided not to put on another interactive remote demo in December. As soon as we are able to meet again, we plan to have a potluck combined with the wood auction, so we can get things going again. We will continue putting on remote demonstrations starting with Lyle Jamieson's Winged Bowl demo on January 21st.

Deep Hollowing System For Sale

A Brian McVoy "One Good Turn" deep hollowing system was donated to the SPSW this week in like new condition. We are selling it for \$400. This is a large "aptured bar" system with a 6 foot long 1.5" heavy steel boring bar that is intended to make turning relatively large hollow forms saferand easy. In the photo, you can see where Devin Garlick and Lset it up to test the system. The heavy captured boring bar prevents any twisting of terque as you hollow, and one can completely hollow the form with pone of the vibration and torque common with some hollowing tools. If we need to evaluate entries and award winners for several months of President's Challenges all at one meeting, then that is what we will do.

Month	Challenge	Description
March	Lidded Box	Lathe turned lidded boxes
April	Shop Built Jigs	Items built to help make lathe turning more efficient or safer. Examples include, but are not limited to circle cutters, items used to make segments, and stabilizing blocks for cutting off spindles and tenons.
June	Use of Color and Texture	Turned projects enhanced with paint, resin of stone inlay, pyrography, paint, dyes, etc.
Aug	Children's Toys	Lathe turned items to play with, such as, but not limited to tops, toy rockets, croquet mallets, automatons, cryptic boxes, or other items that are lathe turned.
Nov	Holiday Decor or Gift	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holidays, or a holiday gift that was turned on the lathe.
Jan2021	"The Podiatrist's Special"	Any lathe turning enhanced by unusual foot treatment. Judging will be based on how the foot design contributes to the aesthetics of the overall project.

Zoom Meeting If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. (If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)

- The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members. So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2018, you will need to go to the members tab on the <u>SPSW website</u> (http://spswoodturners.org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
 - a. Those of you who get the newsletter by snail-mail will need to get us an e-mail address where we can send your meeting invitation. Please send it to (membership@spswoodturners.org)
- 2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
- 3. Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:
 - a. Saturday November 14th The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
 - i. This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
 - ii. Please save this where you can find it.
 - 1. If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
 - b. Wednesday November 18th A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
 - c. **Thursday November 19th** Log into the meeting between 6:30 and 7:00
 - i. Trent's demo will start shortly aver the vote, at about 7:05 PM PDT.
 - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
 - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
 - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.

For Zoom Security, Please Rename If Needed: We have a number of people that participate in the Zoom demos. When you join the session, you will be able to see yourself and the other participants in thumbnail photos with the name of each person under their picture. If your name appears as "John's iPad", or "iPhone 189567", then we don't really know who you are, which is a security issue. If that happens when you join the meeting, please just click on your name, and then click "rename" and change it to your full name. It will help Ramon and me as we cohost the meeting. Thanks!
