## February President's Message

February's Remote Demo: For our February Zoom meeting, we are again partnering with our friends in the Woodturners of Olympia (WOO) to present Harvey Meyer, who is a nationally recognized woodturner. Harvey is well known for his intricate "basketry illusion" enhancements on platters, bowls, and hollow forms. These designs are often inspired by the patterns on American Indian baskets.

During his **3-hour** demonstration, Harvey will take us through the creation of the design, how to print out index wheels for various projects, wood turning, using a beading tool to create concentric rings on the project, wood burning the radials in the wood to create individual cells, and coloring those cells individually to create patterns in the "weaving". Due to Harvey's schedule, length of this demo, and the time zone difference, this demonstration will be held on February 13th, which is the second Saturday of the month, from 3:00 -**6:00 PM**. facturer or quality woodturning chucks and equipment. Almost every week, Mike Davis sends out a notice to woodturners all over the world inviting then to view the next free IRD. There are usually 500 – 700 people viewing these demos from all over the world! But they work just like our IRDs. All I have seen so far have been excellent. To be notified of future events, all you need to do is email <u>miked@recordpower.co.uk</u> and put **RSVP** in the subject line of the email, and he will invite you to the next offering. I recommend this highly!

**Woodrat:** Director Doug Reynolds is our "woodrat", which is a very important position in the SPSW. This position means that Doug has volunteered as our contact person for when a hardwood tree that we might use comes down. Doug checks out the tree, determines whether it is desirable and useful to us, and if so, then he contacts those members to have expressed interest and organizes a cutting party. Most of the wood from these events usually goes to the club for our annual wood auction, but everyone that shows up and helps goes home with some prime pieces of free wood too.

To participate in these wood cutting events and get some of this free wood, you just need to show up and help. You don't necessarily need your own chain saw. There are many things folks can do to help at these events. But you will see how to safely use a chain saw and also will see how to section the tree so you get the best and most interesting wood out of it. You will also have access to people who can help you get started on how to seal the wood to minimize checking, explain the advantages of green wood turning, rough turning, and coring processes. If that sounds interesting to you, please let Doug know, and he can put you on his list and you will be contacted by e-mail when he has wood we're going out to cut. Active Member Registration: Have you noticed that you don't get all the communications that some other SPSW members get or that you are un-

**Zoom Meeting** If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. (If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)

- The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members. So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2018, you will need to go to the members tab on the <u>SPSW website</u> (http://spswoodturners.org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
  - a. Those of you who get the newsletter by snail-mail will need to get us an e-mail address where we can send your meeting invitation. Please send it to (membership@spswoodturners.org)
- 2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
- 3. Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:
  - a. Saturday February 6th The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
    - i. This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
    - ii. Please save this where you can find it.
      - 1. If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
  - b. Friday, February 12th A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
  - c. Saturday February 13th Log into the meeting between 2:30 and 3:00pm
    - i. Harvey's demo will start promptly at 3:00pm.
    - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
    - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
    - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.

**For Zoom Security, Please Rename If Needed:** We have a number of people that participate in the Zoom demos. When you join the session, you will be able to see yourself and the other participants in thumbnail photos with the name of each person under their picture. If your name appears as "John's iPad", or "iPhone 189567", then we don't really know who you are, which is a security issue. If that happens when you join the meeting, please just click on your name, and then click "rename" and change it to your full name. It will help Ramon and me as we cohost the meeting. Thanks!
