The sawdust session is an excellent opportunity for all members to come, join in the comradery of working with other members to learn a variety of new skills or improve on some old ones and

share with new turners a skill they may be struggling with. We meet in a member's shop and we have 3 or 4 lathes all going at once. Wayne Wells has generously offered us the use of his shop for these activities. If you would like to attend, just join us at Wayne's. The address is 12012 28th Ave E, Tacoma 98445. One of our more experienced members is at each lathe showing people how to make good, clean, and safe cuts at the lathe. We can usually put the tools in the hands of people who have never turned anything before. We can also assist with learning how to sharpen tools.

Sawdust sessions are one of most valuable benefits of belonging to the SPSW. We usually have some very new woodturners, some intermediate turners who might have a project with them that they are stuck on, and some very experienced members to help anyone that needs it. We all have great time!

This is a great opportunity for everyone. If you are a new turner, please come! I guarantee you will get to make some cuts, will have a good time, and will make some great friends. Please take advantage of this opportunity and join us.



#### **SPSW Store May Highlight - Index Wheels**

Many of the finest wood turnings reach that level of work with evenly spaced segments featuring carved beads, flutes, piercings, or other enhancements. For example, did you watch the Zoom demo last year on basket illusion platters, and wondered how the intricate patterns were marked on the wood? These elements are usually laid out using an index wheel!

Many lathes come with an index wheel built into the machine, but many do not, or the machine's index is very complicated to use. If you would like to have an accurate, simple to use index wheel, the SPSW Store carries Iron Fire Index Wheels in sizes that fit snugly on most lathe's spindles. They are only \$20 each. These index wheels are precisely drilled with 14, 36, 48 or 60 holes that allow a total of 20 different equally spaced angular radial layout-lines on your project. For example, if you wanted just 9 segments on your piece, you could use the ring with 36 holes, but only use every 4th hole (36 divided by 9 equals 4). Then you can use those lines to lay-out the beads, flutes, or spirals directly on your work. These artistic enhancements enable you to move your work to a higher level.



- 2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
- 3. Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:
  - a. Saturday, May 14th The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
    - i This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
    - ii Please save this where you can find it.
      - If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
  - b. Wednesday, May 18th A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
  - c. Thursday, May 19th Log into the meeting between 6:30 and 7:00pm
    - i. Michael's demo will start at 7:00pm
    - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
    - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
    - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.
