These woodturning demonstrations are a great opportunity to showcase our hobby, put a smile on some young faces, and have a lot of fun yourself. I had more volunteers than I had slots for, so next year I'll try to get a few more slots so that more of us can enjoy this experience.

Most of us have been turning tops at the demos, but some have also done small bowls, or turned handles for kitchen gadgets. Some things are given away; some aren't. Mostly though, we turn tops.

When kids under 12 come by we tell them if they can spin one of the tops we have turned, they get to keep it. We try to color the tops we make, and sometimes the kids even get to pick the colors they want on their top. The look on these kid's faces when they spin the tops, and understand that they get to keep these simple to make toys is worth the effort all by itself! We also get to talk to the parents and other adults that come to look at the samples of our work. Some of the people we talk to are very interested in getting into the hobby themselves, so we also get a great opportunity to promote the

SPSW or direct them to other local AAW Chapters in the surrounding area, if they are not local.

Hello, again, this is Kent Horton, your AAW/SPSW liaison. As an AAW member I get timely email notices of upcoming turning events and tips to enhance my turning projects. I have received three of them within this past week.

The first is an announcement about an upcoming <u>AAW Live Online Event</u>. Glenn Lucas will be demonstrating how to make a Traditional Irish Platter on Saturday, September 17th at 3:00 PM Eastern time. The cost of this event is \$10.00 for AAW members and \$15.00 for all others. <u>Registration</u> is open through Friday, September 16th, at noon Eastern Time. Registrants will be able to replay this presentation online through October 17th. Additionally, WIT (Women in Turning) Presents another 2022 Wood Arts Residency on Saturday, October 1st, 2022 at 4:00 PM Eastern time. Kailee Bosch, Katie Hudnall and Janice Smith will be the featured female artists at this event. Helga Winter will be featured on Saturday, November 5th at 4:00 PM Eastern time. These are wonderful opportunities to showcase the fine turning these women are producing.

The second email was the AAW Toolbox: "Going Against the Grain." This article is a great follow-up to last month's presentation by Dave Best on texturing. A featured video on the use of texturing tools is provided by Mike Peace as well as direct links to related articles from past editions of AAW's American Turner magazine. This email also has a listing of Remote Demonstration Events and a description of AAW's latest publication <u>Tips and Tricks for the Woodturner</u>. I know I am always looking for better solutions for how I do my turning projects.

The third email from AAW was promoting an upcoming Mid Atlantic Wood Symposium via Zoom, on September 23-25, 2022. The \$25.00 fee provides for five or more hours of Zoom programming over the three days of this live event. If interested, visit MAWTS.com to register. Interestingly, there will not be any demos on Zoom, but will have plenty of other engaging events - such as: meeting the vendors, a silent auction, an instant gallery review and the Sunday luncheon (you must bring your own sandwich if participating via Zoom) where demonstrators will compete with one another on the lathe. I am not at all sure how this will work, but what-the-heck it should be interesting. These email notices are a great way to stay connected to what is happening in the greater world of AAW events and activities. Please keep in mind the 2023 AAW International Symposium in Louisville, Kentucky, June 1-4. It will be coming before you know it. Also, applications are now open for the 2023 Artist Showcase. Each year the Professional Outreach Program (POP) showcases two wood artists at the Annual International Symposium. Ideal candidates are either experienced artists who have made a significant contribution to the woodturning field but have not received appropriate recognition, or emerging artists who have the potential to make significant

contributions to the field. Applications will be accepted through October 1, 2022, at 11:59 PM. There is no application fee. Additional information is available at the <u>AAW website</u>.

SPSW Store September Highlight - Gluboost

GluBoost: At last month's meeting, we introduced GluBoost Fill-N-Finish as a new product in the SPSW Store. Those that have tired it have loved the fast and fool-proof results that they get. We ran out last month, but we will have more at the September meeting. Although the full kit sells for \$43, you use just a few drops on small projects like pens, and it will last you a long time. Come grab yours at the Store Sales table at next Thursday's meeting.

Soft Intermediate Sanding Pads: Hook and loop sandpaper mandrels work great when sanding convex surfaces. But on concave surfaces, the sandpaper seems to

quickly wear out on just the outer edge, because the center part of the sandpaper never touches the wood. Woodturners Wonders makes a great soft intermediate pad for both 2" and 3" mandrel sized. These work by allowing the entire sandpaper surface to contact with the project. They will pay for themselves quickly by making your sandpaper last much longer. We will have these in stock for at September meeting.

Rosewood Pen Blanks: A couple of months ago, we had a large donation of pen and pencil making supplies, which included several boxes of Indian Rosewood pen blanks. They dark colored with some figure in some of them, and they are a uniform $\frac{3}{4}$ x $\frac{3}{4}$ x 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ " size. I have turned several pens with them, and they turn beautifully. These also make beautiful finials. The last ones that I had went fast, and I suspect that these will too. Great rosewood blanks sell for \$1.00 each, for \$30 for a box of 35 blanks. Supply is limited, so get then while you can!

Dyna Glide Plus: We still have more silicon free dry lubricant. It is a "go to" product for maintaining or freeing up any metal-to-metal surfaces on lathes, band saws, table saws, and other equipment. I use it all the time on my lathe bed ways, 4-jaw chuck, and bearings. It has no oil, which can combine with sawdust to gum things up, nor does it have any silicon, which causes "fish-eye" problems with many finishes. We have it at about \$10/can cheaper than you can get it anyplace else!

Thank you all for all the support you have given to the SPSW thorough our store sales. Although we offer fantastic prices, the club makes a little bit on each sale, which all goes to support the club's activities including rent and all the equipment we need to put on the wonderful hybrid meetings we have been offering for the past several months.


