




October President's Message by Fred Abeles


You can either pay your dues at the meeting, with the form on page 11, or an even easier method is to do it online through the members only tab on the <u>SPSW website</u>.

October Demonstrator - Dale Larson

Dale Larson lives in Gresham, Oregon and has been turning wood for 43 years. He specializes in turning bowls from local hardwoods, including Pacific Madrone and Big Leaf Maple. His work is both functional and beautiful and much admired by collectors and wood workers alike. His bowls can be found in private collections all over the world.

Dale has taught woodturning classes at John C. Campbell Folk School and Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts. He has been a demonstrator at five AAW Symposiums, eight regional symposia, and numerous local chapters, as well as international events in England and Israel. He has written articles about wood and woodturning in American Woodturner, World of Wood, Woodworker West, Woodturning Design, and L'echo des Copeaux (AFTAB France).

He currently serves on the board of the Larch Mountain Country Artisans and the Board of Advisors of the AAW. In 2019, Dale was named an AAW Honorary Lifetime Member. He served on the Board of Directors of the AAW from 2009 through 2014 as Symposium chair and three years as President. He is a past president of the Northwest Chapter of the International Wood Collectors Society and a founding member and twice past president of the Cascade Woodturners in Portland, Oregon.

A Word From Kent Horton

Hello again, this is Kent Horton with another edition of AAW Connection.

A couple of days ago I received a notice from <u>AAW</u> that their magazine <u>American Woodturner for October</u> was available online. For me this begged the question, "Is it available only online?" I generally go through my magazine and tear out the pages of articles and projects I am most interested in and put them in plastic sleeves to be put in 3-ring binders for later reference. This has cut way down on the number of magazines I collect month after month - year after year. Anyhow, I will wait and see if a print copy arrives in the next few days.

With the online magazine one has the option of downloading it and viewing it as a PDF or viewing it as an Interactive Digital Desktop version. I found the PDF version to be MUCH more user friendly while trying to read it on my Kindle. My suggestion is to try both versions and make up your own mind. Now I am wanting a print version even more.

In this edition of American Woodturner there were several articles dealing with figured wood. The article "Figure In Wood" by Dr. Seri Robinson is an excellent introduction and explanation to the question "What is figure in wood?" and some insights into the various causes of different types of figure — quilted, ribbon, curly, blister and burl. A follow-up article provides a few tips for turning figured wood to get better from this often-difficult wood; to turn and get less tear-out. Tim Wirsing advocates a two-step process of refining the work between using a very sharp gouge and sanding by using a negative rake scraper to smooth out any tool marks and tear-out to achieve a "perfect" surface prior to sanding. He is able to achieve some truly remarkable results that highlight the figure. Cindy Droza also writes an article in this issue on using dyes to make irregular grain patterns to "pop." Wow! I am always impressed with what she produces. She employs a multi-step process of dyes and finishes to make stunning pieces of art.

As always, I encourage SPSW members to join AAW and take advantage of what it has to offer in the way of programs, classes and print materials to help make you a better woodturner.

Just in: You probably received the same notice I did from Jennifer Newberg at AAW, saying that your print copy of the October issue of American Woodturner has been delayed and will be arriving the week of October 17. Well, that answers my earlier question. Thanks for reading.



Saturday Sawdust Sessions

Our next Sawdust Session is happening on October 22nd, the Saturday after the October general membership meeting. Our last Sawdust session was spectacular with 13+ people in attendance. We had 3 lathes going and the sharpening station.

The sawdust session is an excellent opportunity for all members to come, join in the comradery of working with other members to learn a variety of new skills or improve on some old ones and share with new turners a skill they may be struggling with. We meet in a member's shop and we have 3 or 4 lathes all going at once. Wayne Wells has generously offered us the use of his shop for these activities. If you would like to attend, just join us at Wayne's. The address is 12012 28th Ave E, Tacoma 98445. It is just off 112th, between the Summit and Parkland areas.

One of our more experienced members is at each lathe showing people how to make good, clean, and safe cuts at the lathe. We can usually put the tools in the hands of people who have never turned anything before. We can also assist with learning how to sharpen tools.

Sawdust sessions are one of most valuable benefits of belonging to the SPSW.

We usually have some very new woodturners, some intermediate turners who might have a project with them that they are stuck on, and some very experienced members to help anyone that needs it. We all have great time!

This is a great opportunity for everyone. If you are a new turner, please come! I guarantee you will get to make some cuts, will have a good time, and will make some great friends. Please take advantage of this opportunity and join us.

SPSW Store October Highlight - Wave Edged Sanding Discs

Last month we introduced soft intermediate sanding pads for use between mandrels and sand paper disks. If you use these intermediate sanding pads, it makes sanding internal curves much easier. It also makes the sand paper last longer since the entire surface is in contact with the wood, and not just the outer edge. Last month, we immediately sold out and we were also running low on 3" sandpaper discs in some grits too.

This month, we will have a full array of wave-edged sanding discs in grits from 60 – 600 available again. The wave edge more readily adapts to the wood's shape, and does not tend to dig in like some stiff round discs. They also feature a mylar reinforced backing that makes them last longer. The price on these discs is unbelievable. We will be selling 25 count packages of each grit for just \$7.00/pack!

Two other items we have introduced in the past few months have been GluBoost Fill-n-Finish kits (\$43/set) and Dyna-Glide Plus dry lubricant spray (\$15/can).

Feedback from purchasers on each of these items we have introduced has been universally positive. We will have these items as well as our usual inventory available for purchase at the meeting. Stop by the store sales table, and say hi. Access to these items at these prices is a great benefit of SPSW membership. I look forward to seeing you!

Zoom Meeting If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. (If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)b.

- 1. **The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members.** So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2021, you will need to go to the members tab on the <u>SPSW website</u> (spswoodturners. org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
 - a. Those of you who get the newsletter by snail-mail will need to get us an e-mail address where we can send your meeting invitation. Please send it to (membership@spswoodturners.org)
- 2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
- 3. Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:
 - a. **Saturday, Oct 15th** The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
 - i This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
 - ii Please save this where you can find it.
 - If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
 - b. Wednesday, Oct 19th A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
 - c. Thursday, Oct 20th Log into the meeting between 6:30 and 7:00pm
 - i. Dale's demo will start at 7:00pm
 - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
