

As always I will begin with my mantra: "If you are serious about improving your woodturning skills, you owe it to yourself to join AAW. They provide a number of resources focused on woodturning skill development."

I recently received a packet of notices concerning <u>AAW's Segmented Woodturning Symposium</u> on September 26-28, 2025, in Northbrook, Illinois. This event produced by and for a subgroup of AAW features demonstrators that include Robin Costelle, Tom Lohman, Malcolm Tibbetts and Curt Theobald. I did a Google search for each of these individuals and was completely blown away by the WAY BEYOND "next level" of segmented turnings they each produce. If you are at all interested in developing your segmented turning skills, I would STRONGLY recommend you contact Michael Poirier and join him for his weekly mentoring session (contact information: mentorship@spswoodturners.org).

In this month's (December 2024) issue of "American Woodturner" magazine, Al Miotke explains the process of making multigenerational lamination zigzag patterns to create amazing "interest" bands for segmented bowls and closed forms or urns. The patterns created this way are truly amazing and add a wonderful "WOW" factor to any segmented turned piece. I have recently completed making a wegie sled and a "ring press," and have resolved for 2025, to try my hand at creating a few segmented turned pieces. ### January Demonstrator - Jimmie Allen: Turn Your Own Handles

Jimmie will show us three different ways to turn your own handle so that no matter what stage you are at in your woodturning journey or what tools you prefer to use you will gain knowledge for creating your own tool handles. The demonstration also includes the installation of the new tool insert Jimmie



developed that facilitates the removal of tools for ease of sharpening or simply swapping out to a different tool with your new handle.



#### **Do Your Best**

The Pacific Northwest is blessed with so many talented and impactful woodturners. For some of these woodturners, finding a better way to accomplish your goal is integral to their craftsman DNA. Jimmie Allen is the current generation in the evolution of PNW woodturning tool innovation we all know and love as D-Way Tools. He shares that same innovation DNA that sparked the development of the Sweezy gouge (a ½" bowl gouge) by Bob Sweezy (original maker) and Dave Schweitzer (designer).

Jimmie magnetically connected with woodturning and woodturners at the first meeting he attended some 22 or 23 years ago. Dave Schweitzer was demonstrating at the Bemerton Woodturning club that night that Jimmie attended. He instantly felt accepted by the members and knew he had found an awesome new family. Schweitzer quickly became a mentor and before long a father-son level friendship anchored their relationship that endures today.

As his woodturning matured, Jimmie began to focus more and more on lidded boxes. He first learned boxes from Dan Ackerman, who Jimmie nicknamed the Box Master. The nature of a lidded box demands mastery of woodturning craft. All surfaces outside and inside are on show full time for the eyes and the fingers to interrogate. Boxes are a form that allows the craftsman to use one-off pieces of highly valued wood, too small to work for other projects. Timeless and true craft pieces, Jimmie's boxes are intimate, functional treasures that are beautiful to see, sumptuous to touch, balanced when held, smooth and secure when closed and utter a quiet friendly greeting when opened.

Jimmie's nature has always been to do something to the best of his ability. If that means taking the extra time to sand a surface to 1200 or more, then buffing the final surface to a high sheen the result is worth the effort. Whomever enjoys the piece will know it was hand made by a supreme craftsman for their everlasting enjoyment.

As his box skills and craftsmanship grew, he began to see a better way to go about making boxes that involved different tools. Tools that could make a lidded box easier, faster with great quality. Leveraging his relationship with Schweitzer, Jimmie purchased a few tool blanks to develop his box specific tool innovation – double ended tools, with a negative rake scraper grind in various orientations. In his initial development, he ended up with two sets of tools. One he would keep and one he could sell, if someone was interested. Dave told him that once people see what his tools could do, they will buy them. Sure enough, after his first demonstration showing how to make a lidded box with his new tools, he quickly sold his few extras. Jimmie shared that "This was never a planned thing".

But soon after, the word got out and the interest in the new tools grew, he made a second batch of 25 box specific tools in Dave's shop. When those sold out, Jimmie made a batch of fifty and then another batch of 100. That first year something like 300 tools were sold. As the popularity of his new tools grew there came a time to name the product. Jimmie adopted his old nickname for Dan Ackerman and named his tool line, <u>Boxmaster Tools</u>. Jimmie's negative rake scrapers truly change the woodturning community forever!

Interlaced with this initial success with Boxmaster Tools, Jimmie and Dave discussed a transition of ownership for D-Way Tools. So, in the 2018 – 2019 timeframe Jimmie took over <u>D-Way Tools</u> from Dave. Jimmie liked the idea of working in a shop and had some ideas for putting his influence on the product. As the new owner of D-Way Tools, Jimmie later developed additional negative rake scraper tools within the D-Way Tool line.

For me, Jimmie is innately passionate about craftsmanship whether the subject is lidded boxes, woodturning tools or hot rods. He holds himself to high standards of craft simply because it is important to Do Your Best. Jimmie takes quiet joy from a customer response to the quality and craftsmanship uniquely found is his products.

Those of us who earned the rank of Eagle Scout in Boy Scouts will recognize the title of this article as the Eagle Scout oath. It's an achievement that guides and influences us throughout our lives. Visit Jimmies shop and you will find his Eagle Scout badge quietly displayed at eye level. Jimmie earned his Eagle Scout at the age of 15.





Originating in the early 1900s, Eleanor Roosevelt was an early member. Our local chapter may be visited at <a href="mailtrusagigharbor.org">altrusagigharbor.org</a> which, by way of the annual Empty Bowls event, funds other local charitable efforts. Zoom Meeting If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. (If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)b.

- 1. **The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members.** So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2023, you will need to go to the members tab on the <u>SPSW website</u> (spswoodturners.org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
  - a. Those of you who get the newsletter by snail-mail will need to get us an e-mail address where we can send your meeting invitation. Please send it to (membership@spswoodturners.org)
- 2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
- 3. Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:
  - a. **The Wednesday the week before the meeting** The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list. (This is if we get the link by then)
    - This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
    - ii Please save this where you can find it.
      - 1. If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
      - 2. If you did NOT get the email, the link will be posted on the SPSW website under For Members/Zoom Meeting Link
  - b. **The Saturday before the meeting.** A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list
  - c. **The day of the meeting** Log into the meeting by 7:00pm
    - i. The demo will start at 7:00pm
    - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
    - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
    - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.
